## **Tolstoy Research**

- 1. Go to my website, under the AP III tab and download the "tolstoyshorts" file (Under "Leo Tolstoy's Three Questions (February 7)"). Open the file and only read the first story, *The Three Questions*. Based on the story, what kind of man do you think its author, Leo Tolstoy was? What was his philosophy, what were his beliefs, etc.? Use examples from the story to support your claim. (1 paragraph 8-10 sentence minimum answer)
- 2. Using you iPad to do research, learn about Tolstoy and complete the questions/activities below in order to get ready to read about Chris McCandless in *Into the Wild*.

"Long captivated by the writing of Leo Tolstoy, McCandless particularly admired how the great novelist had forsaken a life of wealth and privilege to wander among the destitute." —Krakauer, Author's Note

• Create a timeline of Tolstoy's life that shows how he went from wealth to voluntary poverty. Also include his major novels/works.

"In college McCandless began emulating Tolstoy's asceticism and moral rigor to a degree that first astonished, and then alarmed, those who were close to him." —Krakauer, Author's Note

- What is asceticism?
- In your own words, describe Tolstoy's moral rigor: what did he believe, how did he put these beliefs into practice, etc.? Cite the sources that helped you reach your conclusions.

Use evidence to support your claim and cite the source the evidence came from. (1 paragraph, 8-10 sentence minimum)
